RATIONALE FOR THE FEE:

The board rate is driven by three factors: overhead, per meal costs, and dining dollars. The current request for an increase is based on a 5% increase in the cost of food and an increase in dining dollars (actual money that can be spent in venues beyond the dining commons) requested by the students. We did not increase the overhead rate this year. In addition, we are requesting approval to increase the board rate each year by no more than 5%.

NUMBER OF STUDENTS POTENTIALLY IMPACTED BY THE FEE:

All students who live in the residence halls (2000).

International Student Fee

RATIONALE FOR THE FEE:

UNLV’s request is identical to a fee already charged to international students at UNR. International student enrollment requires the careful monitoring of students in accordance with the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services’ policies. Specialized services are necessary to support international students in their admission, visa status, advisement, legal status, and adjustment to the United States. The need for additional specialized staff and technical support to comply with immigration reporting requirements and admissions processes has increased the cost of admitting and retaining an international student. The result of SEVIS (the Student and Exchange Visitor Information System), implemented after 9/11, requires that we more closely track and monitor international students and report to the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services. In addition, new regulations regarding the issuing and reporting of I-20 documents, change of status, enrollment information and SEVIS reporting compliance

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NAME OF FEE

Graduation, Diploma or Certificate Fee, all programs

RATIONALE FOR THE FEE:

The fee supports costs associated with students' degree completion and graduation: graduation applications, verification of completed degree requirements, student notifications, official diplomas, and commencement ceremony expenses that include facility rentals, programs and receptions.

The fee was last increased in 1993. Since that time, the number of students graduating annually from the University has increased 70 percent. The current fee structure does not support the general costs associated with verifying students' degree completion, diploma costs, postage, processing materials, and labor costs. Also, the increased number of students graduating from the University has resulted with the need to expand the number of commencement ceremonies from one to three ceremonies each year.

NUMBER OF STUDENTS POTENTIALLY IMPACTED BY THE FEE:

Approximately 3,900 students apply for graduation annually.

- The number of students attending the University has increased substantially and patient visits to the Student Health Center have increased as well.
- The cost of medical supplies and equipment continues to increase at about 10% a

Other options have been considered and this proposal represents the most economical option.

Section 17. Apartment Rentals, UNR

1. University Village apartments shall rent for [~~\$365~~] \$375 per month (effective [7/1/03] 7/1/04) with a rental agreement requiring 30 days notice of intent to vacate. Rent shall be payable one month in advance. Before moving in, the tenant shall pay the first and last month's rent (partial month prorated), plus a \$100 cleaning and damage deposit, and a \$15 key deposit. The ~~\$115~~ key, damage and cleaning deposit shall be refunded in whole or in part upon the termination of the rental agreement and the peaceful surrender of the rented premises with the premises left in a clean and habitable condition (ordinary wear excepted) and with a complete inventory of furnishings. Inspection will be made by an authorized agent of the University.

Other apartment and houses owned by the University.

RATIONALE FOR THE FEE

The University is requesting an approximate 5% rate increase for University owned apartments and houses. Increases are based upon comparable area rental rates and rising maintenance costs.

NUMBER OF STUDENTS POTENTIALLY IMPACTED BY THE FEE

As of January 2004, there are 53 students occupying the rentals.
