Section 8. Grants-in-Aid, Nevada Resident Widows/Widowers and Dependents of Certain Veterans

- Except as otherwise provided for the child or spouse of a member of the Nevada National Guard killed while performing duties as a member of the Nevada National Guard in Title 4, Chapter 17, Section 13, grants-in-aid [Grants-in-aid] for the payment of a specified portion of the registration fee are available for a maximum of 128 credit hours of attendance to the following Nevada resident persons:
 - a. Widows and widowers of veterans, servicemen, or servicewomen who died from injuries or disease incurred or substantially aggravated in the line of duty while in active military service in the Southeast Asia War, the Gulf War of 1991, the Afghanistan Conflict of 2001, or the Iraqi War of 2003.
 - b. Children of those set forth in paragraph "a" above who were financially dependent upon the
