## HANDBOOK REVISION: Special Admissions

## BACKGROUND \& POLICY CONTEXT OF ISSUE:

During the August 2007 meeting of the Board, regents took action to allow for the admission of additional students at the universities under the existing alternative admission criteria established by the Board. At that time, there was a discussion about the need for a more holistic approach to admissions and a move away from "alternate admissions."

Pursuant to Board policy (Title 4, Chapter 16, Section 7), students who do not meet university or state college admission requirements may be admitted under

Section 3. [Grade Point Average] Requirements for Admission to the Universities

1. Students seeking admission to a university must complete the high school course requirements pursuant to Chapter90 TdTter TD4.
2. Students who do not meet university or state college admission requirements may petition under procedures established by the university or state college for special consideration to the alternative admission program. The number of students admitted under these criteria may not exceed 10 percent of the previous year's freshman enrollment.
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3. A student who does not meet the state college admission requirements established in subsections 1 through 3 may, under procedures established
