#### 2. BACKGROUND & POLICY CONTEXT OF ISSUE:

UnderTitle 4, Chapter 14, Section 16 xisting Board policy sets for the following system wide course numbering rubric so that all baccalaureate transfer courses are clearly identified for students:

- Renedial/developmental courses 001-099 a.
- b. Lower-division courses 100-299 300-499
- Upper-division courses C.
- State College graduate courses 500-699 d.
- University graduate courses e. 500-799

Numbering for courses within the NSHE professional schoolstispecifically distinguished within this policy. These schools often have courses that may look like other undergraduate or graduate courses (such as "biology"), but are unique and only offered through the professional school.

Responding to a question/request from UNLV regarding the development of courses for the UNLV School of Medicine, System staff recommenters ising existing policy to provide the option of using a distinct course numbering systerfor NSHE professional schools.

#### 3. SPECIFIC ACTIONS BEING RECOMMENDED OR REQUESTED:

AmendTitle 4, Chapter 14, Section 16 specifically allow professional schools to establish their own distin course numbering rubric that extends beyond the numbering rubric set forth under the policy for undergraduate and graduate courses (001-799).

This policy revision is recommended by System staff with the support of the Academic Affairs council facilitate of the development of courses for the UNLV School of Medicine

#### 5. BULLET POINTS TO SUPPORT REQUEST/RECOMMENDATION:

x Professional schools ay need the flexibility to distinguish their courses from other similar courses at undergraduate and graduate levels so there is no confusion for students and other stakeholders involved in reviewing course offerings at the professional schools or the institutions generally.
